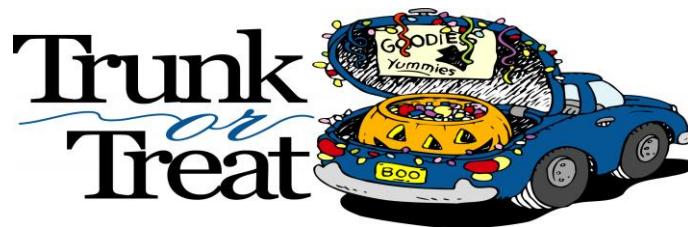

FROM THE PASTOR'S HEART

What is the Christian attitude towards the elections – any election? First, what are some of the negative attitudes Christians may have?

1. **Apathy.** They just don't care. They don't spend much time praying for God's will to be done in the election.
2. **Pessimism.** They worry. This demonstrates a lack of trust in God that He is in control of the outcome of every situation.
3. **Negative.** They choose to focus strictly on the negative sides of any issue rather than being open to the positive points of the opposing views.
4. **Criticism.** They choose to attack our potential leaders relentlessly with unchristian comments that hurt their Christian witness.
5. **Judgmental.** They choose to champion their candidates by putting down other people. They will say things like, "I don't know how you can be a Christian and vote for that candidate." It seems to make us feel better about ourselves when we can put others down.

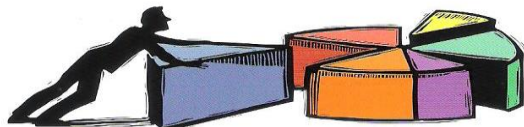
So, what should be Christian attitude? The truth is...it is the same attitude that we ought to have in any other circumstances in our lives. We are to be caring, kind, and loving. Even when we speak, we speak the truth in love. We are to be on our knees in prayer. We are to be trusting God wholeheartedly that He is in control of all circumstances in our lives and in our world. We are to employ Godly wisdom and learn how to tame the tongue. We learn to attack the problems, not the people.

Unfortunately, many Christians compromise their values at election time, the values they keep the rest of the year. They seem to think that during election time it is all right for Christians to attack one another and that God gives us some special kind of permission to be mean and cruel to each other. The result is – as Christians we lose a great opportunity to demonstrate Christian love and to show the world that we are different.

Next week, I will look closely at some guiding scriptures that will help us to face all circumstances in our lives with the proper Christian perspective.
